### Item 6: Consider Adoption of CEA Rates Effective February 1, 2023

- Recommendation:
  - Conduct the Public Hearing: Open the Public Hearing, Receive Public Testimony and Close the Public Hearing.
  - Adopt Resolution 2023-001, amending Resolution 2021-017, setting rates for Clean Energy Alliance effective February 1, 2023.



- Setting rates is a critical function for CEA
  - Appropriate rates are crucial to CEA's operational and financial success
- Goals/Priorities in Rate setting process
  - Generate revenue sufficient to cover costs
  - Fund the minimum 5% Financial Reserve contribution
  - Meet credit facility covenants
  - Maintain competitiveness with SDG&E
  - Provide customer rate stability



Rate Development Process

SDGE Rates – Exit Fee\* & Franchise Fees = CEA Starting Rate Discount by 2% - CEA's targe minimum = CEA Initial Rate


CEA's Initial Rate used to calculate resulting revenue generation to determine if sufficient to cover costs.

If rate is sufficient Initial Rate is Proposed Rate.

\* Highest Exit Fee of CEA's vintages is used



Projected Revenue & Expenses - Budget and Updated



- Rates when Budget Adopted sufficient to meet projected expenditures
- Energy Market Conditions have driven up expenditure projections
- Current Rates no longer sufficient to meet expenses in current fiscal year




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Market Conditions Impacting Costs


• Western US Natural Gas price spikes driving up California power

prices






Projected Revenue & Expenses - With Rate Adjustment



- Proposed Rates generate revenue sufficient to cover costs
- Provide minimum 2% generation savings compared to SDG&E
- Funds to 5% Financial Reserve
- Meet credit covenants

# Item 7: Consider Approval of CEA Working with San Diego Community Power in Exploring Establishment of a Regional Energy Network

- Recommendation:
  - Approve CEA working with San Diego Community Power in exploring establishment of a Regional Energy Network and direct staff to return with results and next steps.



- Key Goal of CEA Programs to support achievement of Climate Action Plan goals of Member Agencies
- No CEA funds currently available for programs
- Evaluating options for alternative program funding
- Regional Energy Network is one possible alternative to bring program funds to CEA

- SDCP has authorized funding to hire consultant to assist in evaluation and application processes



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- Staff recommends Board approval to work with SDCP in evaluating establishing a REN
- Staff to return with results and next steps

  - May 26, 2022 Resolution 2022-002 established meeting schedule for July 2022 – June 2023
    - Identified San Marcos as physical location
    - At that time Oceanside and Vista were not members
  - Board requested staff evaluate feasibility of Oceanside as physical EAN meeting location
